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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Sholapur Social Associations Arts and Commerce College, Solapur, established in 1978 has been a renowned institution of education providing education from UG to Ph. D. The college is run by educational trust named as Sholapur Social Association which was established in 1953 with aim to provide quality education in mother tongue to the minority community from KG to Ph. D. College is approved as a grant in aid from government of Maharashtra. The college is permanently affiliated to Punyashlok Ahilyadevi Holkar Solapur University, Solapur. It has got *Muslim Religious Minority* as well as *Urdu Linguistic Minority* status from Government of Maharashtra. College is providing B. A. degree with English, Geography and Urdu specialization; B. Com. degree with Advanced Accounting specialization and M. A. with Urdu specialization having Ph. D. Urdu research centre. College has provision for teaching all subjects both in English and Marathi medium.

The college is the only single affiliated college of PAH Solapur university which provides degree in M.A. (Urdu) and Ph.D. in Urdu. Our college has included in the list of 12B and 2F of University Grant Commission (UGC). College has got ISO 21001:2018 certification in 2021 for Management Systems for Educational Organisations. Our college is leading Muslim minority institution in western Maharashtra providing quality education to Muslim minority community.

The Sholapur Social Association is the religious and linguistic minority institute located at the heart of the city. The trustee of the Association are visionaries with spirit to serve for the cause of education have established this educational institute to give formal education to the students of the minority in Solapur and nearby areas. The college has the 45 years of experience in the field of education, supporting thousands of students. Presently our college is affiliated to the Punyashlok Ahilyadevi Holkar Solapur University Solapur; the institute has permanent affiliation to the UGG and Solapur University. The college is running the academic streams of Arts and Commerce and Post Graduate in Urdu. The Undergraduate Arts and Commerce streams are being taught through English and Marathi medium and we have Research Centre in Urdu literature. Our faculties are working on several of the university like members of the Board of Studies, Academic Council, Central Research Committee, Departmental Research Committee, Dean of the Humanities; one of our faculties is elected at the Senate Member of the University. All full time teachers have acquired Doctorate in their respective subject. Seven teachers are Ph. D. guide in Solapur University, 12 Research Scholars have acquired doctorate from our college. Our faculties have authored 35 books and 115 Research papers in reputed journals. The minority language Persian is being taught and preserved in our college, our student from department of Urdu has secured Gold Medal at B.A and M.A. University has granted us two units of N. S.S. the unit is active in extension work with NGOs. Our NCC unit is affiliated to 38th Maharashtra Battalion Boys and Girls both are recruited into NCC. We are running skill development courses under self help scheme for the girls to make them economically independent. We have Social Kanya to give financial help to the poor girls. Our college is known for sports, our players are representing University team in West Zone, State team, all India University games and National Level in Hockey, Football, Basket Ball, Volley ball and Table Tennis. college strongly promotes education, culture and sports

Institutional Weakness

Weakness.

Weakness: As college is affiliated to the University, there is limited scope to academic flexibility in curriculum planning. Solapur is the city of laborers and drought prone area hence the student enrolling in here is from financially poor background, many of them an unable to pay admission fees and examination fees. Majority of the student in the institute are schooled through Urdu medium, when they adapt English or Marathi medium for commerce and social sciences they take time to cope-up with new languages Limited play-field fir Cricket, football and hockey, many players cannot afford sports kit the college lacks Hostel facility and has no residence for Principal. The city bus services towards the college is very poor and every student cannot afford own vehicle. The Municipal drinking water supply to the city is four day alternate hence drinking water to the college is insufficient as our college has no professional programme we are lacking in campus selection. As the disputes among the members of the management is created and the matter is admitted to the Charity Commissioner therefore the college is has limitation for the infrastructure development and introduction of new course.

Institutional Opportunity

Opportunities:

The institute has the status of religious and linguistic minority and being the minority institute we are at freedom to start the courses of our choice in mother tongue, we are at liberty to admit more than 50% minority student in course. Urdu is being taught at degree level and Post Graduate Level. We have monopoly of chairing the Board of Studies, and membership of Academic Council and curriculum designing in university. Ours is the only research Centre in Urdu for research in Urdu literature for the Doctorate of Philosophy. We are fortunate to teach Urdu to the Non-Urdu persons in the city. Many teachers are the members of Board of Studies it's an opportunity to design the curriculum of the University. Our professor has got opportunity to be research guide for Ph.D. We are fortunate to participate in cultural programmes of the University and other colleges. Publishers of the Research Journals and Books Publishers are at our door to publish our research work. We have established Career Guidance Cell and competitive exam guidance cell in collaboration with NGO it's an opportunity to secure government jobs. Our Alumnus is professionals, traders and politicians they have donated Podium, Dias and open gym instrument to the college. One of our alumnus is Ex-Mayor of the city and six are Municipal counsellor, it's a big opportunity for us to avail civic amenities like road towards college, sufficient drinking water, leveling of play ground, tree plantation, help in running health programme like pulse polio, Corona Vaccination, Sterilization of college etc. The can generate funds from alumni poor boys fund, the alumnus are employing the present student in their firms and offices. Our department of Urdu has recognized a P. G and research centre in Urdu hence we in MOU with NGOs organize Poetic meets, Gazal concerts, Urdu Drama. Our college is collaborating with other colleges, university, State government and NGOs for organizing seminar, conferences, workshops and awareness programmes. NCC is a good opportunity for the girl's student to join forces.

Institutional Challenge

Challenges : Our college building is located in the heart of the city, surrounded by thick population and market the environment is noisy and polluted, Augmentation of infrastructure is difficult The student enrolled in the college are from financially poor background they cannot afford admission fees, examination fees and other study material. Non-availability of Hostel for the student. Catering the academic needs of the underprivileged students. Students are from Urdu background it takes time for them to pick up the medium of instruction I.e. English and Marathi. Scarcity of reference books, kindle books and soft copy of books. Government scholarship and beneficiary schemes for the minority students are not communicated to the college in time. Entering into MOUs with foreign University and NGOs is difficult because of strict norms of the government. Recruitment of teachers is stopped since last ten years. Few are doing the work of more. Unavailability of the faculty training courses. ICT infrastructure in teaching. Teachers are asked to go for Census and on election Duty. The government has stopped Non-salary grant. Autonomous colleges in the city have posed a challenge before us. Distance education universities. Girls student get marry in early age. Tendency of the student for seeking the job before completion of the education. Passive parents for the education of their dependent. Less support for the industries and firms for the training and employment of student. Networking with the alumni. Interference of local political parties and student union in college academic affairs.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Our students are on the merit list of the university and the overall passing percentage is excellent. We have the maximum number of Representation to the university in the form of Members (Senate), Members (Academic Council), Chairperson and members (Board of Studies), Chairperson and Members (Syllabus Sub Committee), Chairperson and Members of CRC, Chairperson (Lapses Committee), Members (Local Inquiry Committee), Members (Department of Research Committee), Member (Board of Sports) etc. This gives ample of opportunities in contributing towards the design and development of the university curriculum. Our faculty has contributed towards the designing and editing of textbooks. Some of the books written and edited by our faculty are being used as reference books by our university and other universities too. Regular feedback is obtained from students, teachers, employer and alumni. The feedback analyzed and action taken report is communicated to consern athorities. Student centric methods and aimed at improving their performance. College takes initiative in organizing workshops for the benefit of the teachers and students. Faculty offer their services as resource persons at workshops, seminars and conferences. We upgrade our teaching methods and try to bring about a lot of innovation in the teaching- learning process. We have a Memorandum of Understanding with a number of academic and non-academic institutes and the collaborative activities with these different Institutions give our students the much-needed impetus and exposure. We have committees in the college which cater to the curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities and development of our students. We conduct remedial and enrichment programs for the slow and advanced learners. For proper planning and implementation, we prepare the academic calendar, timetable and the annual teaching plan even before the commencement of the academic year. The Mentor - Mentee scheme helps in monitoring the progress and other issues of the students on a regular basis. We frequently arrange expert lectures, competitions, seminars and conferences with the view to upgrade our students. Our focus is on empowering the girls through quality education. We focus on imparting value-based education and installing morals and ethics within our students.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

- Sanctioned strength of full time teachers: 21. No. of full time teachers on Roll: 21 (100%)
- Teacher-student ratio of the college is 1:35.
- No. of teachers with Ph.D, NET, SET Qualification 21 (100%)
- Academic activities are planned in advance and the academic calendar is prepared and uploaded on the college website.
- Admission is done based on merit as per the Minority Rule of the Government of Maharashtra.
- Mentoring system is functional and mentors are assigned in the ratio 1:20 (average). Entry level test is conducted and bridge course is conducted for bridging the gap in learning for slow learners.
- Student centric Teaching methods like seminar, assignments, quiz, lab experiments, projects, field visits, Bank Visit, Industrial Visit, Educational Tours, Guest Lecture, Practical Assignments, course viva, group discussion, role play, tutorials, Use of ICT, problem solving sessions are incorporated into the curriculum and are designed into the course plan.
- Student centric learning is given the largest weight among components of continuous internal assessment.
- Total 5 workshops were conducted for ICT enabling of teachers during the last 5 years. Teachers were given training on tools like Google forms, Google meet, Zoom and Google Classroom.
- Internal exam, exam policy and mechanism of internal examination are impalement effectively
- The entire External examination process is fully automated for all Pre examination and postexamination processes like online application, online payment, download of hall ticket from the

examination portal, approval of marks from the portal, submitting feedback on question paper and raising grievances on examination, internal mark entry by teachers, processing of results by the examination section.

- There is a Grievance Redressal Cell where student can put up complaints regarding injustice mater out of them
- Programme outcomes and course outcomes are displayed in the college website.

Excellent pass percentage (97%), good academic progress and achievements (6 Gold Medal and 08 of University Ranking) of students are testimony to the concentrated and committed efforts in the teaching, learning process.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Our College professors and student researchers conduct investigations, publish scholarly articles, and secure research grants, contributing to the expansion of knowledge across diverse fields. Their research not only advances academic disciplines but also beneficial for policy advocacy.

Research supervisors are providing guidance to more than 24 Ph D scholars.
- More than 115 research articles are published on various social, economic, technological and linguistic topics in reputed journals and 35 of them are in UGC care listed Journals. College has established research center in Urdu and geography and commerce laboratories.
- College conducts village survey and organized study visits banks and industries to give practical knowledge and research experience. This hands-on experience not only enriches their learning but also nurtures a culture of innovation and problem-solving.

Our College conducts collaborative activities partnering with industry, government agencies, and other educational institutions to exchange knowledge and resources. These collaborations lead to create awareness about AIDS, Environment Conservation, Gender Equity, National Integrity, Health and Hygiene, Adverse effect of Social Evils and Democratic Rights and Duties etc. Some collaborative programs are: Aids Awareness Rally, World Population Day Rally, Organ Donation Rally and Activities, Free Health Check up Camps, Blood Donation Camps, Library Visits and various research and Skill development Workshops etc.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Sholapur Social Association Arts and commerce college was established in the year 1978 The college has its own building situated at Sidheshwar Peth Solapur, having Survey No. 10659 ad-measuring 2300 square meter (i.e. 02 acre) land consisting 2295 square meter built-up area the land is used for the construction of class room, library, offices, lab and auditorium and remaining is for the playing ground for basket ball, volleyball and parking lot. The total land is used in the following manner

The college has a grand main gate opening leading to the porch and staircase. The wall compound of the college lurked with flex of NSS.NCC and Maulana Azad Open University. The main porch of college consists of notice board, flag pol and green zone. There are two stair cases leading to first floor made for boys and girls separately, water purifier and cooler are installed at entrance of both staircases.

The first floor of the college Room No.01 to 11. The series has department of Geography department, Auditorium, IQAC office, Exam control Room, NSS Office, Principal office, Administrative office. Computer Lab for girls, Library and Gymkhana. The Library has Books-16650, Journals-13. News paper-8, Inflibnet and Vridhi software etc. Second Floor consist of Room No. 12 to 20 all are class rooms except Room No.18 as the Staff Room. The staff contain Urdu research centre, and all subject departments. Third floor consist of Room No. 21 to 28 all are class rooms. The terrace of the college lands the two water tank and a large Solar Panel.

The college is well equipped with Information Technology Infrastructure. At the first floor department of Geography, Auditorium, IQAC office, Exam Control Room Principal office, NSS office, college office, computer lab, library and gymkhana have several computers, printers internet and wifi facilities. We are using BSNL Broad Band and Gigabyte for google search and chrome.

The play ground of the college is used for parking.

Student Support and Progression

Various types of Post Matric scholarships, free ships are aptly distributed to SC/ST/OBC students and the college provides financial assistance to economically backward and deserving students in the form of instalment facilities, and fee waivers through poor boys fund. The college provides financial assistance in the form of cash prizes for students who excel in academics and sports. During the assessment period 976 (Sum of Rs. 1268864 INR) students have benefitted from the scholarships and free ships provided by the Government and by the institution or non-government agencies respectively. College has instituted a unique Social Kanya Yojna for helping needy and poor students for continuation of education and to reduce dropout rate. Initiative for capacity building is done through skill enhancement programs and certificate courses, focus is given on Language and Communication Skills, Life skills (Yoga, physical fitness,health and hygiene) and ICT/computing skills. College effectively runs skill-based courses such as Certificate course in Staff Secretary, fashion designer and Medical Record Assistant etc. The competitive guidance Centre create awareness among the students regarding competitive exams and placement. The career guidance cell run General Studies and Foundation course for UPSC/MPSC/Group C & D Exam and also organizes a number of lectures for the benefit of the students. The college has a transparent mechanism for settling grievances. Students are free to raise their grievances through Grievance Redressal Cell offline mode. Anti-ragging Cell ensures a ragging-free campus. A

duly constituted Internal Complaints Committee deals with sexual harassment complaints. All the committees follow the guidelines laid by the respective statutory/regulatory bodies. Students secured awards/medals for outstanding performance in various sports and cultural events at the university, inter-university, state, and national level competitions. Our students actively participated in culture, sports events organized by institution and by other institution. The registered Alumni Association contributes significantly to the development of the institution through generous donations, organizing activities, and providing financial/logistic support to various programs.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The governance of the institution is reflective of and in tune with the vision and mission of the Institution. The college committed to its Empowerment through Higher Education of Weaker and Deprived Students of Minority Community, Backward Class Irrespective of their Cast and Creed. In academic year 2020-21 college has successfully conducted National Webinar on Role of Teachers in NEP Implementation - Awareness, Orientation, Challenges and Responses. A perspective/strategic plan is a futuristic planning document that lays out core areas of emphasis.

College Implemented e-governance in areas of operation like Administration, Finance and Accounts, Student Admission and Support & Examination. For the promotion of teaching staff college adopts rules led down by UGC & PAH Solapur University regarding self appraisal. EPF, DCPS & NPS is offered to the eligible aided staff. Teaching & Non Teaching Staff had a Sholapur Social Association Employees Co-operative Credit Society. Teaching and non-teaching staff participating in FDP, professional development/administrative training programs. College conducts External audits regularly, financial records and statements are shown in true and fair manner. Maintaining and Utilizing Physical, Academic And Support Facilities college had a Resource Mobilization Policy. The college has established the Internal Quality Assurance Cell immediately after First accreditation to develop awareness for consistent quality improvement in the overall performance (academic and administration) by focusing on strategies for quality enhancement and its implementation. IQAC conducted various workshop Collect the feedback of various stakeholders, conducted Career Guidance cell motivational speech on interview technique in collaboration with Jamiat a Ulma E Hind, Solapur. International Conference on Recent Trends in Research Methodology, delegate from all over India participated. Organized University Intercollegiate Hockey (M/W) Hockey Tournaments, Health Check-up for Girls. College has got ISO 21001:2018 certification for Educational organizations - Management systems for educational organizations. AAA was conducted by PAH Solapur University for the academic years from 2019 to 2022 accredited Grade B. Green Audit is to review the overall environment management systems. Gender Audit was attempted to study whether the college has good gender balance. NIRF & other quality audit/accreditation conducted in college, that are NAAC & ISO Certification.

After the completion of term, each teacher submits the syllabus completion reports to the head of the department. All teaching staffs are well qualified with doctorate and SET-NET. Our teachers use of modern methods of teaching and effectively uses ICT tools for teaching. These include Google classroom, Google forms, Google meet, ZOOM, YouTube videos, etc. Each class has the Whats-App study group for sharing curriculum and course information. College has five smart classes, two classes with LCD projectors, two computer labs for effective curriculum delivery. 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

The College has an efficient mechanism of internal and external assessment which is transparent in the conduct and also in the rectification of grievances. The grievances are solved with utmost priority in a time-bound manner. The College strictly follows the guidelines of the PAH Solapur university while conducting the internal assessment and end-semester examinations.

Broadly, there are two types' assessments: Continuous monitored Internal Assessment (CIA). Comprehensive External Examination (CEE) and The CEE is controlled by the PAH Solapur university. For CEE role of the College is to implement the directions of exams from the University.

INTERNAL and EXTERNAL ASSESSMENT MECHANISM

College has its own Exam policy a part of a continuous evaluation system conducted through session tests, assignments, projects and presentations. All of these constitute an integral part of internal examination which is carried out in a systematic manner. First term and second term tests are conducted within the stipulated time as mentioned in the academic calendar and assignments are also given to the students. College has Examination Committees for smooth conduction of internal as well as semester examinations. Every department is entrusted the responsibility of preparing question papers for examinations in due time and submit to the respective committee. The marks of Term wise examinations are informed to students in class, through departmental notice boards and via What-App study groups. Circular regarding university examinations are communicated to the students and staff time to time.

MECHANISM FOR GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL

The College has its own exam policy; College is keen to address grievances related to assessments (both CEE and CIA). Students have multiple channels to raise their grievances including the subject teachers, Head of the department, examination committee, and principal. The grievances are classified into College and University levels to take appropriate action.

Grievance Redressal System:

The college has an effective, systematic and transparent mechanism to resolve the issues of the students regarding internal and external examination. Students are free to interact with the exam committee to resolve grievances if any, regarding the assessment.

- Exam committee members are assigned the duty and their contact numbers are shared in the Whats-App group/ Website for technical assistance for the students for smooth conduct of online exam.
- Any discrepancy in the assessment is resolved by the exam committee. Exam committee has shared contacts for the grievances of the students related to exams and results.
- The grievances during the conduction of the examination and discrepancies in the mark sheets are addressed and discussed in consultation with exam in-charge and if necessary, students write the

application and submit it to the exam committee.

- The examination committee after consultation with the Principal does the necessary tasks to remedy the issue. The outcome of the process is conveyed to the students by examination committee.
- The grievances related to end-semester University examinations such as revaluation, duration, and relevance of the question are collected by the principal through CIA and the same is communicated to the exam section of the affiliated University.

As the college is affiliated to the PAH Solapur University, it takes meticulous initiatives to follow the POs and COs framed by the University. The POs and COs are displayed on the website and also in the brochure of the college.

METHODS OF IMPLEMENTATION

The initial level discussion takes place with the IQAC on the outcomes framed by the university. In addition to that, the academic advisory body will recommend Collegial-level POs and COs. The body of department heads, teachers, and invited domain experts will frame the department-level POs and COs. The same will be shared with teachers at the beginning of the academic year as part of the FDP.

The admission officer of the College and teaching staff counselors who are engaged in the admission process explain the POs to the students. In addition to that, the COs will be explained to the students during their induction program.

The IQAC of the college along with the concerned departments prepares the program outcomes and

course outcomes in alignment with the university prescribed syllabus, the core values and objectives of the college. At the beginning of the session the teachers orient the students on the prorgamme outcomes and course outcomes of all courses.

The Programme outcomes and course outcomes are made available in the college website for ready reference. Hard copy of syllabi and learning outcomes are available in all the departments for ready reference to the teachers and students.

Tt is designed to incorporate the teaching, learning and assessment strategies in such a way as to give enough weightage to each of the specified learning activities and attainment of outcomes. Along with the prescribed curriculum and traditional teaching methods like lectures, assessments, quiz, notes sharing, assignments etc. smart boards, ICT tools, projectors are employed, partially automated library with text books, reference books and e-resources.

There is an effective and transparent continuous internal evaluation system comprising of Terminal test, attendance and assignment which helps in the improvement of students' performance. After completion of the programme students go to higher studies, some students are recruited in different sectors.

Response:

The College, which provides quality knowledge, skills and abilities which students can achieve through the courses. At the beginning of the academic session, teachers orient the students to make them aware of the program outcomes. Students are made aware about the benefits and prerequisites of a graduate program and the various academic and employment avenues arising out of it. Students are also oriented with CBCS program and also discussed about the semester system and examination pattern (Semester Exam, attendance and home assignments) in the undergraduate program. The program outcome and course outcome are also made available on the college website for the benefit of students.

Methods of evaluating the level of attainment of POs and COs in the institution are as follows: Performance of the students in the classroom is observed through their level of engagement in classroom activities like their ability to answer questions posed by teachers regarding any specific topic contained in the course. Participation of students in group discussions and departmental seminars. Assignments, Class-tests, Projects and Field works, Bank Visit, Industrial visit are also good indicators. Teachers analyze how well the students embrace their knowledge of the programs and outcomes in writing answers. All the departments maintain evaluation records and, on this basis, the attainment levels of COs are obtained. Analyzing the records of placements and progression to higher education of the students in various governmental, non-governmental and private sectors. and different fields is reflective of the success and realization of the Programme Outcomes

Teaching plans are prepared by faculties of every department in accordance with the academic calendar of the affiliated University. Departmental Teaching plan and syllabus completion Report are maintained to evaluate the timely completion of the course by the faculties which ensure the efficacy of the teaching-learning program.

ASSESSMENT OF ATTAINMENT OF POs AND COs

There are multipronged mechanisms to assess the attainment of POs and COs.

1. COMPREHENSIVE EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

Comprehensive external examinations are conducted at the end of each semester by the affiliating university to assess the attainment of credits for each course. The maximum score is 50 in which domainbased theoretical and logical questions are asked in the assessment. The answer scripts are evaluated by external subject experts from different Colleges decided by the university.

2. CONTINUOUS INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Continuous Internal Assessments are carried out by the College to assess the performance in class participation, preparations of case studies, fieldwork, participation in group discussions, term papers, performances in seminars/workshops, paper presentations, and report/content writing, etc. The attainment is assessed out of 50 marks for each course. Questions of internal exams were mapped with Course Outcomes using Bloomstaxonamy methods.

3. GRADUATE ATTRIBUTES FEEDBACK

The IQAC conducts feedback surveys among the pass-out students about the graduate attributes that include major components of POs and COs. The students can rate their attainment on a 10-point scale.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1

Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

The college conducts Internal and External audits regularly. It has appropriate mechanism to ensure that financial records and statements are shown in true and fair manner as required by the Accounting standards and prevailing laws.

Internal Audit:

Internal audit is a continuous process which ensues after each and every financial year transaction of institution Conducts Internal and External Financial Audits Regularly College Conducts Internal Financial Audits Regularly by M.A. Achkal & Co. Solapur.

Internal audit takes place at two levels namely receipts and payment. The receipts of the fees collected from the students are checked by the auditor.

The official letters, official funds collected, and bank statements are checked by the internal auditor.

Donation receipts are also checked by the auditor. At payment level the account of the purchase bills is entered in the tally system, vouchers are created which come under various ledgers.

The payment vouchers are verified by the Accountant signed by the Principal and authorized Management signatories.

There after cheques are issued to the concerned parties. This is again verified and checked by the tally

system.

Salary of aided and unaided staff, deductions, Tax deducted at Source (TDS) is verified by the Internal Auditor.

External Audit:

The external audit takes place after the completion of financial year. The Chartered Accountant, who works as an External audit Conducts External Financial Audits Regularly by M.A. Achkal& Co. Solapur.

The audit program goes on for 15 to 30 days during the month of May/June.

The nature of the payment is categorized into

- 1) Revenue Expenditure
- 2) Capital Expenditure

The bills and vouchers of the revenue expenditure is checked. The vouchers and proper record with the concerned Department of the capital expenditure is also checked and verified.

The audited statements and accounts are submitted to the Governing Body/Board of Trust who merged these with other sister concern educational institutions and submit it to the Government authorities including the Charity Commissioner for Maharashtra state, Mumbai. The Income Tax Returns are also filed with the Income Tax Office, Solapur. The college also prepare various returns based on annual accounts to other government offices like Professional Tax Returns, Provident Fund Returns, returns for determination of amount to be paid to Gratuity Accounts and TDS returns. For the grants received from the UGC, DST-FIST, utilization certificates are prepared according to the allowed expenditure under various heads. This is duly checked and submitted to the corresponding authorities. This is also audited by the external auditor nominated by Governing Council/Board of Trust. Statutory external audit and assessment of Income-Expenditure and Receipt-Payment is also done by the Auditor General of the Government of Maharashtra periodically after every five years.

To guide the student of B.A., M.A. & Ph.D. for research in Urdu

language and literature. Ascertaining multi-faceted values of different ages.

The Context:

India is a multilingual country. People of different religions live together. Everyone has different languages ??but all lives together. 2. BEST PRACTICES

Women Empowerment through Self-Employment Training Program

Objectives of the practice:

Sholapur Social Asso. Arts and Commerce college is established by the religious minority in Solapur. The intention is to impart education to the minority in Solapur. The students in the college hail from poor families. In that direction we planned to give training to the students the girls; the trained girls can apply their creativity to give production of daily use at home and outside, this could make them economically

independent.

We in collaboration with L.G. Kakade Trust and Family Planning Association of India organized selfemployment training programme. Both the institutes with their instructor trained the student to make dolls, scented sticks, perfumes, talcum powder, purses, vax candles, envelops, nail polish, detergent powder, clay work etc.

The Context:

There challenges and issues that made us to introduce self-employment training programme. Student to our college hails from poor family background and are unable to bear the educational expenses. The self-employment training camp train them to make daily need items like detergent powder, talcum powder, soap, nail polish, perfumes and vax candles, dolls, hanky, envelop and bindi etc. The raw material required for is easily available and affordable this help the student to produce daily need items and earn, the earnings accelerate their art and produce more to earn their livelihood.

The Practice:

As we are going to adapt National Education policy in near future, it gives open choice to the student to choose the subject of their choice such as skill development, entrepreneurship, marketing skill, sales management, production quality control, business ethics, self-employment and self-help etc . Such feature of the course will meet the feature of the meet the objective of the NEP

The institution enter into MOU with L.G. Kakade trust and Family Planning Association of India with an objective to impart skill development and self-employment training programme. appealingthe student to join the skill development or self-employment training workshop; girls are enrolled for the course and ask him or her to bring the raw material to prepare the goods, toys and other daily need items. Students are trained for three days; their products are kept open for exhibition for all in the college premises.

Evidence of success:

As the student learns to make vax candle, perfumes, talcum powder, washing powder, dolls, rings, envelops, cotton bags etc. Some of them have prepared the goods and daily need items at home and are being sold to their friends and relatives, the students are earning now. Besides earning they are learning entrepreneurship, sales management, social marketing.

Problem Encountered:

Some problems like efforts in making MOUs with outside organizations, clarifying out objectives to the directors of the NGOs, the objectives and practice of the MOU members may differ. The student enrolled in the course is asked to bring the raw material for their product, some student cannot afford to bring such raw material, and raw material is damaged in training process good. The members of the social sciences association are in touch with people in marketing, branding and NGO to inspire the student small entrepreneur.
