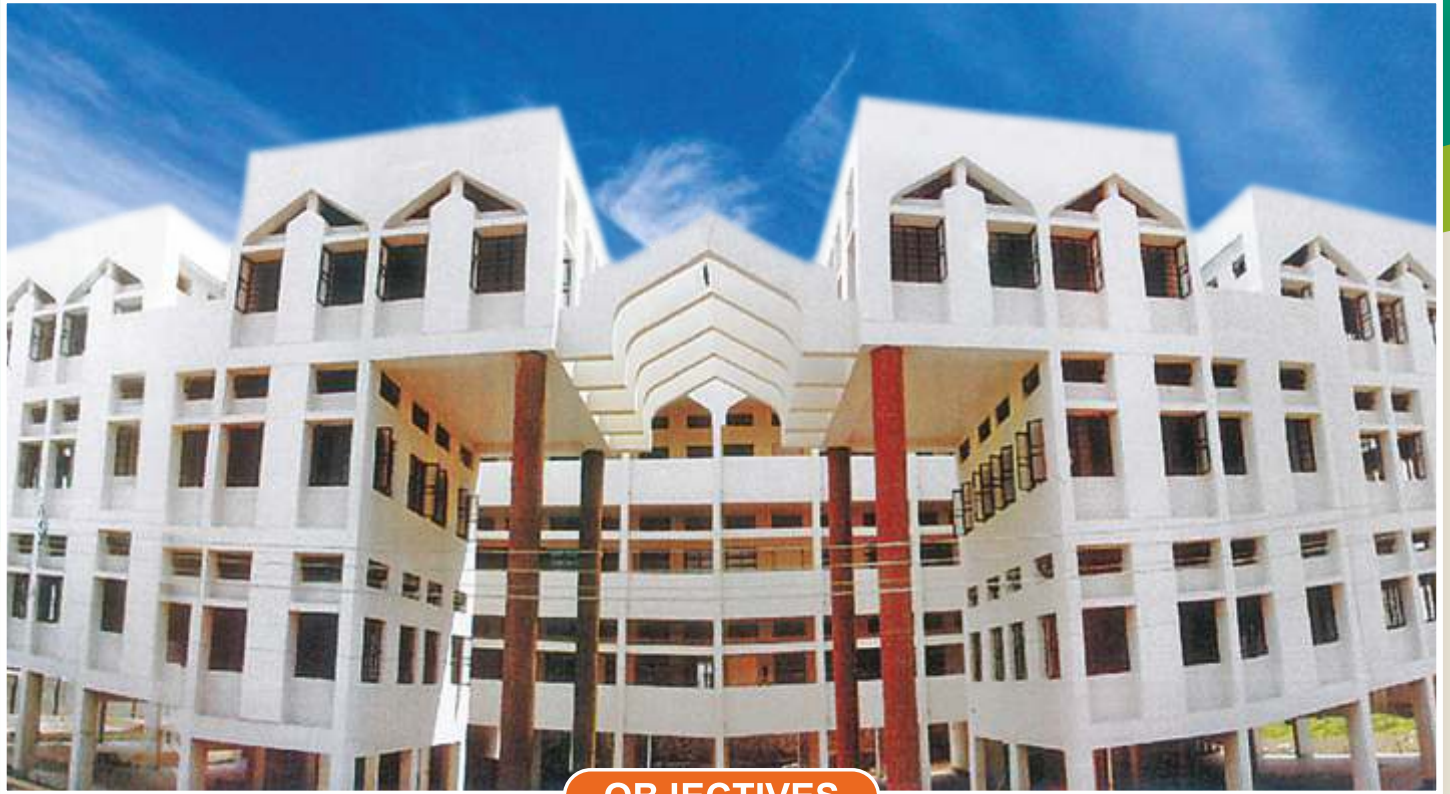

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

Parents / Students are requested to go through the guidelines given below and also see the notices put up on the College notice board or College website for the online Admission. The admissions to the college shall be subject to the following terms and conditions.

- a) Students should take online admissions and use only the prescribed forms allotted by the college .
- b) Admission committee for each class helps the students in making proper choice of optional subjects.
- c) All admissions shall be provisional and subject to confirmation by the principal and university.
- d) Admissions are made on the basis of merit.

Students who seeking admission in this college, should adhere to the following rules and regulations strictly.

- e) If he/she remains absent continuously for a long period, he/she will immediately be informed by the letter, and if he/she fails to respond to the letter, his/her name shall be struck off from the college register without any further correspondence. In such case he/she will not be liable to claim for EBC/BC/ST/SC or any other Govt. facility and the college has power to recover his/her fees.
- f) He/She shall not be allowed to fill in the examination form & appear for the examination unless he/she completes at least 75% days attendance during the academic year.
- g) If any of the statement made in application form or any information supplied by the student in connection with his/her admission later on, found false or incorrect, his/her admission will be cancelled.

Rules Of Discipline

- 2) Students if found indulging in anti national activities contrary to the provisions of the Acts and laws enforced by Government will be liable to be expelled from the college.
- 3) Ragging of students in any form within or outside the college is strictly prohibited. Defaulters will be strictly dealt with as per Govt. instructions in this matter.

The Library

The college has more than thirteen thousand books to cope with the needs of students, studying both in Arts and Commerce wings. The library subscribes Eighteen popular periodicals and Eight newspapers in English, Marathi, Hindi & Urdu. It remains open from 7-30 a.m. to 6-00 p.m. Books are issued for home reading on all the working days. Reading-room facility is also made available for boys and girls separately. The teaching staff of the college has started Book Bank Scheme for the students.

Bachelor of Arts

After the completion of three years programme in Bachelor of Arts (B. A.) the students could be able to gain:

B) Critical and Creative Thinking :

The students could learn to analyze and critically reflect on complex problems incorporating multiple perspectives and innovative thinking.

This includes the ability to:

- 1) Analyze, synthesize and integrate knowledge

- 2) Critically evaluate the validity of arguments and conclusions - Practice creative thinking and expression.

- 3) Demonstrate the capacity to argue in innovative directions.

C) Literacy and Communication:

The students could demonstrate the ability to extract and convey information accurately in a variety of formats.

This includes the ability to:

- 1) Identify, locate, comprehend, and critically evaluate quantitative and qualitative information using visual, numerical, oral, aural, and textual sources.
- 2) Communicate concepts and information clearly and in various formats (oral, visual, written, etc.)
- 3) Engage effectively with audiences from different backgrounds

D) Evaluate and Problem solving:

The students could engage in scholarly inquiry to identify and investigate questions of a theoretical and/or applied nature.

This includes the ability to:

- 1) Identify gaps and limitations in the existing literature
- 2) Understand the principles of the problem solving
- 3) Apply appropriate problem solving methodologies to specific problems
- 4) Develop intellectual independence and practice self-directed inquiry

E) Depth and Breadth of Understanding:

The students could gain detailed knowledge in one or more disciplines and integrate knowledge and perspectives across disciplinary boundaries.

This includes the ability to:

- 1) Develop a detailed understanding of the current state of knowledge in one or more disciplines
- 2) Recognize the value, use and limits of multi disciplinary learning-Cultivate an openness to consider and engage alternative research perspectives
